## 2019 WESTAR ENERGY/HAINES-WEBER SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Deadline to apply is March 1, 2019.

### CRAFT SCHOLARSHIPS

A minimum of six craft scholarships will be awarded yearly in the amount of \$3,000, renewable for up to two years.

Selection Criteria: Award based primarily on personal interview or job shadow, however academics (minimum ACT of 18, minimum GPA of 2.50) and volunteer work are also taken into consideration. Scholarship administration and selection is performed by the Ellis Foundation.

#### Eligibility requirements:

- Must be a resident of Kansas or attending a Kansas high school
- Must be an upcoming graduating high school senior or must have graduated last year
- Must be pursuing a degree in electric power and distribution, power plant technology, wind energy, industrial technology or other industry-related degrees
- Must be eligible to obtain a Commercial Drivers License (line worker scholarship only)
- Must enroll as a full-time student in degree program (does not have to be enrolled prior to scholarship award, but must be a full-time student in degree program to receive award)
- Must maintain 2.5 GPA during degree program
- If 18, must be willing to submit to a Motor Vehicle Record Check (drug free with no DUI convictions)
- Females and minorities are urged to apply

- Attend a mandatory one-day Lineman Prep Day (Date to-be-determined for a Saturday in April or May)
